John

The church in Thessalonica was a study in contrast. They had been a quiet and holy people. But after a while, they had become restless and impatient. They needed direction on how to live. So Paul wrote the young church two letters. The first commended the believers for their faith and encouraged them to continue living according to the gospel principles he had taught. The second letter was filled with helpful hints that corrected their wrong beliefs, assumptions, and behaviors. Whether we are living a quiet and holy life or one that leaves us restless and impatient, Paul's letters encourage us. They challenge us to remain faithful in a temporary world. During his visit to them sudden persecution arose, and the believers had sent him away for his safety. Paul wrote to these new converts from paganism--to encourage them in their trials, to instruct them in godly living, to urge some not to neglect daily work, and to give assurance concerning the future of believers who die before Christ returns.

(1 Timothy 3:14-15), The two letters Paul wrote to his protégé Timothy were inspired by God for our Learning. Nowhere can we get closer to Paul's mind than when he's talking to his true child in the faith, Timothy. Yet these letters were not for Timothy alone—they reveal God's plan for our Lives as well. The context of 1 and 2 Timothy is the Christian mission. Christianity is missionary at heart, so to be a disciple of Jesus is to be a missionary. Jesus himself was on a mission: he was sent by his Father and "came into the world to save sinners" (1 Timothy 1:15). Because all Christians are engaged in the mission of Christ, the letters of the great missionary apostle, Paul, are obviously important to us.
